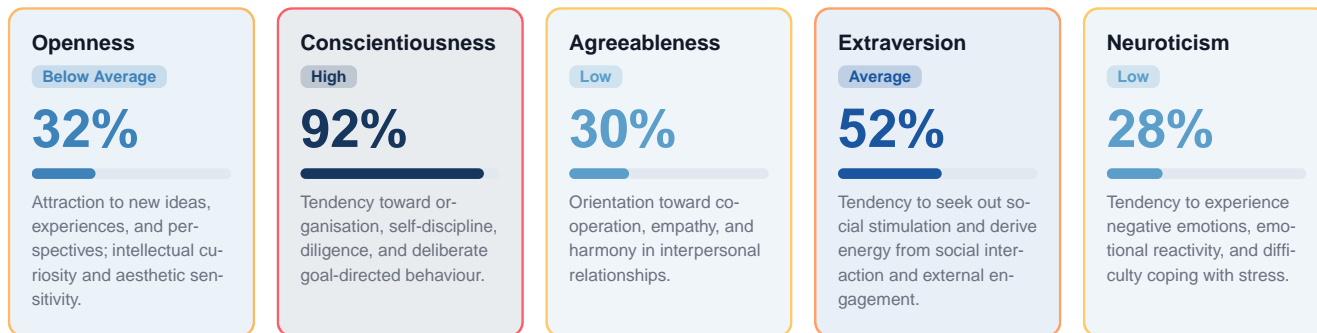

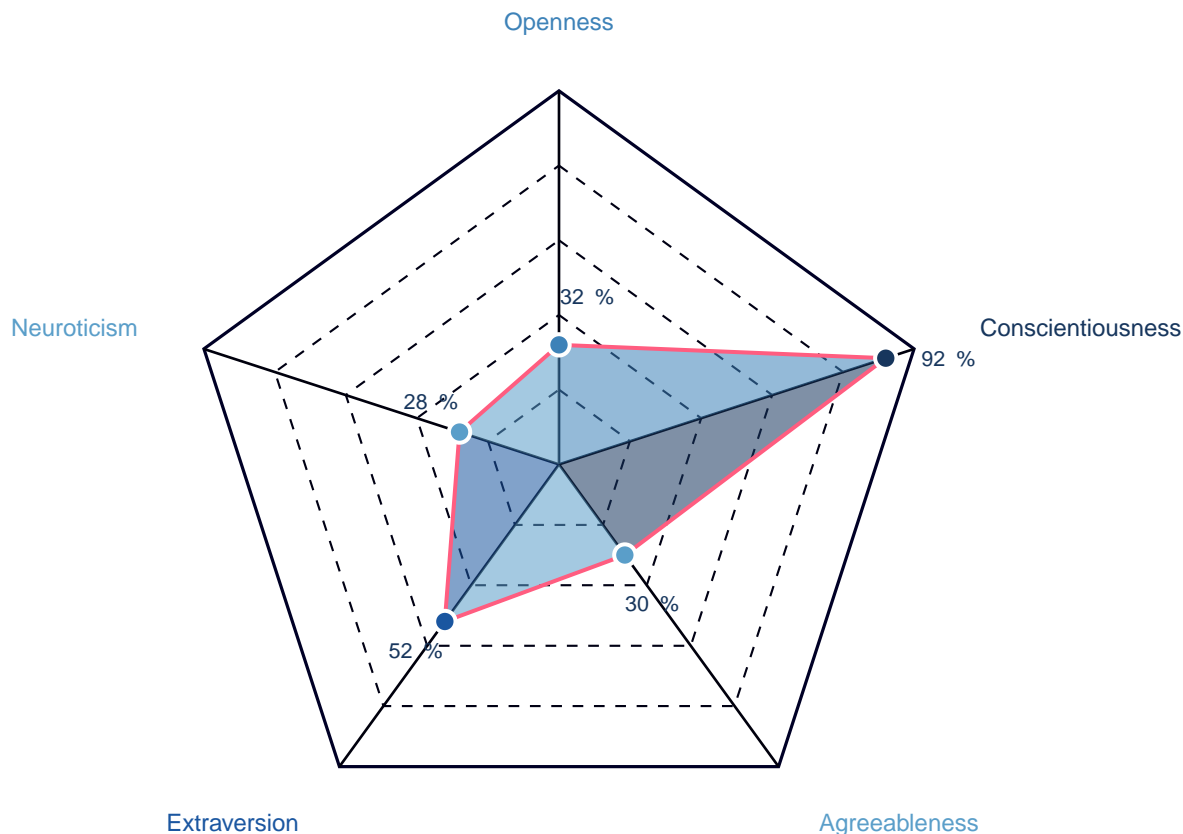

These dimensions — Openness, Conscientiousness, Extraversion, Agreeableness, and Neuroticism — describe characteristic patterns of thinking, feeling, and behaviour. Scores reflect relative standing on each dimension and should be interpreted in the context of the individual's broader life and work situation. No score is inherently good or bad; each profile is unique.
